** STUDENT SAFETY **

Please DO NOT USE THE BUS LOOP during arrival and dismissal. The bus loop must remain clear for the busses to safely drop off and pick up students without additional traffic. Additionally, no students should be dropped off before 7:30am. They are not supervised until 7:30am, so they will need to remain in their vehicles until then. Thank you for ensuring the safety of our students.

SKYWARD FAMILY ACCESS

You can access your student's information through your Skyward Family Access. Students in MS and HS will also receive a login to access their academic information through this portal. You can access Skyward Family and Student Access by going to our website www.landmarkacademy.net and selecting the Skyward family access icon. You can download the app to your smart phones. Make sure you select the Landmark Academy District. We are not affiliated with the Port Huron Area School District. If you need help with your login and password, you can contact the hospitality desk You can design your account to email you information such as progress reports, update your demographics, update emergency/pick up contacts, update Skylert contacts, complete needed forms, enroll new students, and much more.

Winter greetings! As I care for your child at school, it is very important that I know all important medical information. Please update the school with information such as:

- Medications your child takes at the school
- Allergies Please notify or confirm that the school is aware of severe allergies. If your child has
 food allergies, there is a form that can be attained at hospitality which will be how the cafeteria will
 be alerted.
- Please confirm by checking skyward which should have important medical information in the alert info box under emergency contacts. Contact the school if information needs to be added to skyward.

Tips from the nurse:

- · Hand washing!
 - -The single most effective way to prevent sickness.
 - -Have soap available at home in an accessible place for family members to wash their hands when arriving home from public places and remind them to do so.
 - -Wash hands before eating any food
 - -Hand sanitizer should not replace hand washing, as it does not do as good a job.
- Best way to know if your child should stay home if not feeling well is to keep your child home if they have one or more of the following:
- Fever of 100 or greater the morning of school (be aware that medications such as Tylenol and Motrin can mask a fever). Note: Do not send your child to school until they have been fever free for 24 hours without the help of medicine.
- · Persistent cough that brings up phlegm
- Diarrhea or vomiting in the last 24 hours
- Earache contact your doctor without delay
- Rashes only ok to send your child to school with a rash if your doctor indicates it is safe to do so
- Head lice- intense itching of the scalp is usually the primary complaint. After inspection of the hair
 which will display nits (eggs) that resemble dandruff but are difficult to pick out of hair and gray
 like parasites may be seen. Treatment for lice is done at home using a shampoo with a permethrin
 ingredient and the child must be checked by the school nurse before school re-entry.
- Remind your child to not share hats, coats and combs with other students as this is a way to transmit head lice. Check your child's hair and contact the school to notify if you suspect they have head lice

Reminders:

 Please do not send cough drops to school with your child. They are considered medication and may not be taken in school without a signed medication parent form.
